WORKSHOP POLICIES

Due to the Health Department, food is not permitted to be taken home

CANCELLATION POLICY:

Cancellations must be made at least one calendar month prior to the first day of your child's workshop. No exceptions.

No refunds, credits, or rescheduling will be provided for cancellations made after this time. Cancellations made at least one month prior to the start of camp will receive a refund minus a \$30 cancellation fee.

INSUFFICIENT ENROLLMENT:

A specific workshop may be cancelled due to insufficient enrollment up to 7 days before the class date. Upon class cancellation, you will be contacted and provided a full refund.

DRESS CODE:

Children should be dressed both appropriately and safely. Aprons will be provided for each child in the kitchen. We suggest you dress in comfortable, casual clothing with closed-toe, low-heeled or flat shoes and have hair pulled back off of face.

Because the kitchen can be a dangerous place, we do not allow any child to wear the following items:

- Open toe shoes such as sandals, crocs or flip flops
- Tank tops with drawstrings or shirts with long loose sleeves
- Rings, bracelets, long earrings and loose necklaces/chains

CELLULAR PHONES: should be placed on "vibrate" or turned off while workshops are in session. Talking or texting on the phone in the kitchen is strictly prohibited. If necessary, you may use your phone outside of the kitchen.

In an emergency the parents will be called as soon as possible on the phone number provided on the registration form. Please be sure this phone number is a number you can easily be reached on.

ALLERGIES: We do not use peanut oil in our culinary workshops. However we cannot guarantee a nut-free environment. If your child has a specific allergy, please describe it in detail with your registration. Severe allergies will be handled on a case by case basis.

DROP OFF & PICK UP: Children should be dropped off no earlier than 15 minutes prior to their workshop start time. Likewise, children must be picked up promptly after class. Instructor and/or counselors remain with the students only 15 minutes after each session. Due to our small size, we do not have a waiting room space for students, family members or guests.

ILLNESS: Please be considerate to the other students, and do not send your child to workshop if they have had a fever or diarrhea in the last 24 hours. Please be advised if your child has an active cough

and/or need to blow their nose frequently you will be called to pick-up your child. It is recommended they do not attend the workshop as illness can easily be spread thru foods and food preparation. There is no make-up as workshops are scheduled in advance and no additional space for add-ons.

LEGAL NOTICE: Participation in a Playing in the Kitchen Culinary Workshop will involve student use of cooking equipment and tools in a busy kitchen environment. It is understood and expressly agreed to by the Parent (or student) that by making payment for (including the redemption of a gift certificate or volunteering) and/or by participating in the class, the Parent/Student releases, indemnifies and hold harmless Robin Goldstein, Playing In The Kitchen Culinary Workshop and contractors, from any and all liability of any kind for any damages and/or injuries incurred in connection with the students attendance at a Playing In The Kitchen Culinary Workshop and understands and accepts the risks inherent in the preparation, cooking and eating of food with other people in the kitchen.
